We are excited to bring you our first Northwest School Mental Health newsletter!

The <u>University of Washington Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences</u> hosts the new Northwest Mental Health Technology Transfer Center (MHTTC) which is now providing services to the four-state region of Alaska, Idaho, Oregon and Washington. As part of the Northwest MHTTC, the <u>UW SMART Center</u> hosts the Northwest School Mental Health Training and Technical Assistance (TA) Center. Originally a one year supplement to the core Northwest MHTTC, we were recently notified of a second year of funding. This funding will allow us to offer additional training and consultation opportunities for educators and community providers that deliver mental health services in schools. We will be sending monthly newsletters to alert you to training opportunities and regional events, share new resources, spotlight school mental health efforts in the four-state region, introduce you to our partners and let you know how you can get involved.

#### Meet our key staff!

**Eric Bruns, PhD,** is a Professor of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences in the University of Washington School of Medicine. Dr. Bruns's research focuses on public child-serving systems, and

how to maximize their positive effects on youth with behavioral health needs and their families. As Associate Director of the UW SMART Center, he leads the Center's Technical Assistance Core and directs its Institute for Education Sciences (IES)-funded Post-doctoral Research Training Program.

Kelcey Schmitz, MSEd, is our Multi-tiered System of Supports (MTSS) and School Mental Health Training and TA Specialist. She has experience providing training, coaching, and evaluation to schools, districts, and other community agencies to meet the social, emotional and behavioral needs of students within an MTSS Framework. Kelcey has a Master's Degree in Special Education from the University of Kansas and brings our initiative extensive experience leading state-wide MTSS efforts.

The Center goals are to:

- Provide training and technical assistance on implementation of mental health services in schools and school systems
- Build infrastructure and create learning communities
- Support educational leaders to promote mental health for ALL





#### NEW Guidance to States and School Systems on Addressing Mental Health and Substance Use Issues in Schools


